War on the Home Front: United States Soldiers and Southern Civilians in the Civil War.

Currently under advance contract with the University of North Carolina Press. Project argues that placing southern civilians at the center of the story of wartime military policy recovers the crucial role of gender and race to the United States Civil War. The army's presence motivated ordinary people, particularly Black and white women, to make bold demands on officers and soldiers. Even when divided by social hierarchies, the groups could be allies as well as enemies, and occasionally collaborate on military policies designed to punish Confederates and end the war.

Slavery, War, and Emancipation in the Coastal Atlantic. Second monograph which will focus on a small community of free and enslaved African American families, following them from the antebellum period through the Civil War and into Reconstruction. While I am still in the early stages of the project, focusing on a specific community will allow me to illuminate larger obstacles to freedom, self-determination, and citizenship during the long nineteenth century while also examining the vital role of kinship and family ties during war and emancipation as well as Reconstruction's challenges and opportunities as experienced by a small, close-knit group of people in the Coastal South and New England.
